

AMJ INTERNATIONAL MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT

(Financial year ended 31 December 2019)

Introduction

This statement is made pursuant to section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. It constitutes the Ahmadiyya Muslim Jamaat International's (AMJ) slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ended 31 December 2019.

Our Organisation

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Jamaat is a dynamic, fast growing international revival movement within Islam. Founded in 1889, it spans more than 200 countries with membership exceeding tens of millions. Its current headquarters are in the United Kingdom.

We are governed by a Board of Trustees who volunteer their time to help direct our work. They oversee our Directors who manage our 200 plus staff across the whole charity. Our staff are directly employed and are generally not in any category which is seen to be vulnerable to modern slavery in this country. Accordingly, our primary focus is to ensure there are policies and due diligence procedures in place for our suppliers.

Our Supply Chain and Policies

AMJ is committed to continuously improving its practices to identify and eliminate any slavery and human trafficking in its business and supply chains, and to acting ethically and with integrity in all its business relationships. AMJ has a number of policies which deal with its approach to tackling the risk of modern slavery in its supply chain such as a Whistleblowing Policy.

AMJ's commitment

We are continuously reviewing our high-risk areas, and have ensured all new contracts align to our Modern Slavery policy. We are committed to continuing to enhance our capacity to identify, prevent and mitigate any actual or potential risks in these areas.
